## 1. <u>To receive Apologies for Absence.</u>

## 3. Planning

## 3.1 18/00035/FULMAJ – Frilsham Lime Quarry.

Proposed new house of exceptional quality and design, landscape enhancements and associated works.

Members of the council had attended a site visit prior to the meeting. Three letters of comment have been placed on the WBC website; two supporting the proposal and one impartial.

It was noted that the quarry is an industrial, brownfield site which currently represents "a bit of wild Frilsham". The gas pipeline goes through the site (35m each side of which cannot be excavated in any way).

The proposed new dwelling, whilst on the large side is considered exciting and complementary to the site.

It was unanimously agreed that Frilsham Parish Council has **no objection** to this application, but recommends that an external lighting plan is a condition of any planning approval and that permitted development rights are removed.

### 3.2 17/03502/HOUSE – 4 Four Cottage, Beechfield Lane.

Two storey side extension and loft conversion.

Frilsham Parish Council unanimously agreed to **no objection** to this planning application.

## 3.2 18/00218/CERTP – Middlewood, School Lane.

Formation of habitable rooms in the roofspace with front and rear velux rooflights. This is an application to determine whether the proposal can be developed under permitted development rights. It was agreed that Frilsham Parish Council has **no comments** to make on this application.
